WEBSITE- Remember to check our website regularly. The website contains valuable information and is our venue to provide this information to our residents, such as minutes, bylaws, notices and upcoming events. RVAB is also now on Twitter, so you can also follow news using that media.

BOAT LAUNCH- The boat launch was repaired, and is still undergoing some final tweaking, but we were really pressed for time to get it at least useable. Council will be moving forward to improve the access for launching boats and watercraft as early as possible this spring.

COMPOST PILE- The dumping area for leaves, grass, and clippings etc., has been relocated. Please cooperate and save our maintenance staff additional clean-up hours by dumping your leaves and grass immediately beside the pile and not just at the edge of the cultivated area.

BURN PIT- Again a reminder, the burn pit is for trees and burnable wood only. There have been several occasions when prohibited items, such as plastics, metal, and other non-burnable items have been disposed of in the pit. Continued disregard will result in the burn pit being locked up and only available while being supervised. It is planned to clean out the pit before spring, so please do not dump there while it is locked.

GARBAGE DISPOSAL CONTAINERS- As requirements change for fall and winter some of the containers may be locked. This will eliminate unnecessary cost during off peak times of the year. Tires, Bar B Q's, fridges and scrap metal cannot be placed in these containers. Continued abuse

will result in the containers being locked and only opened for specific time periods.

RODENTS - There have been rat sightings reported to council. If anyone notices rats, skunks or whatever, within our village, please contact the administrator. We do belong to a provincial program to deal with these issues.

BYLAW ENFORCEMENT - Council expects all residents to educate themselves on non-compliance for bylaw infractions, such as excessive dog barking, abandoned and/or unlicensed vehicles, non-compliant buildings and trailers, including more than one living accommodation on a lot, unkept and unsightly yards. The program of Bylaw enforcement was initiated in 2017. That will continue in 2018 and tickets and fines will be issued for non-compliance.

The bylaws are on the website. If you have any questions about whether you may be in violation of any bylaws, please contact any member of council or our administrator.

VILLAGE MAINTENANCE- Applications will be accepted for the position of "full time" maintenance person for RVAB. The applicant must be experienced in operating mowing and road equipment and have a basic knowledge of diesel motors, as well as a fulltime resident of RVAB and available 12 months of the year.
